Your application will be processed at the next board meeting and you will be notified of the decision as soon as possible via email.

If your application is honored we will send you the information needed to fulfill your application such as personal- and payment-information. Once you paid the one time admission fee (currently 15 euros) and the contribution (currently 0 euro), you will become an official E.S.A.I.V. Serpentine Member and therefore will receive:

- A voucher for a Serpentine shirt, with which you can claim a Serpentine shirt on the next batch-order of shirts (of which you will be notified).
- Access to the Serpentine Slack.
- Access to our internal education resources.
- Allowed to participate in competitions by joining a competition team or setting up a competition team in compliance with the Serpentine guidelines.
- Participation rights to all our internal (social) events.
- Voting rights in the General Members Meeting and Special Members Meeting.
- All other associated benefits and of course a fun group of people to hang out and learn with.
